However, Pompey opposed this and ensured Sulla's burial with honours. This disrupted trade and some lands remained untilled, leading to food shortages and hunger in Rome. Metellus and Pompey descended from the Pyrenees to the River Ebro. For that general who does not restrain himself can never restrain his army; nor can he be strict in judging others who is unwilling for others to be strict in judging. His policy was one of reconciliation and rehabilitation. When Pompey went to Syria he was visited by ambassadors from Syria and Egypt. This forced the two Roman commanders to separate. Pompey and Crassus would spend most of his time settling disputes between cities and kings or sending envoys to do so. However, when Mithridates won back almost all his kingdom and caused havoc in Cappadocia which was allied with Rome and had been left undefended, Glabrio did not go to the front, but delayed in Bithynia.
