My father would witch wells, mostly for clients who had already dug numerous Wishing for Water holes without result. Water was pumped through a pipe on the ground floor of a two-storey barn. On the upper floor, each dowser was asked to determine the position of the pipe. The first account of the divining rod being used to find water was in when a supply of water was needed for a well. That flat stone induces the reaction. One neighbor had to have 6 wells dug. Some dowsers prefer branches from particular trees, and some prefer the branches to be freshly cut. The grapevines pins as Arthur Lee Brown find water. Like most diviners, Brown and a few of the Wake County dowsers refer to their skill as witching from the witch hazel, a popular divining rod of the early American settlers but it's usually called finding a well, spotting a well, Wishing for Water water. But, the truth is, dowsing consistently fails in objective tests.
